# TO BE DISCUSSED

After reviewing the maintenance report, General Manager Houghton gave the following updates:

- Zenner has not completed testing all the meters yet and no new issues have been made.
- He and Office Administrator/Secretary Thornton will be meeting with representatives of SGPWA and CRWA to discuss pre-grant process; will be assessing the District's top needs to determine which grants to apply for first.
- California did not meet the Governor's Stage II Water Restrictions which required all Districts to cut back usage by 20%; new mandate will be issued soon and will update when information is received.
- *IRWM postponed their application deadline, will be submitting application this week; More grant money is available to small Districts, just need to figure out how to ask for it to ensure all projects are covered.*
- Will be adding more water storage to the project list which was listed as a requirement on the State's Sanitary Survey conducted in June; Secondary water source is far too costly.
- Will begin working on new policies for vacant lot and commercial account requirements soon; will be enlisting the help of local and State agencies as well as legal counsel.

## 8. Old and New Business

a. **SGPWA Update:** Went over the status of the State's drought and restrictions as well as new guidelines that may be issued with the new mandate. Minutes can be viewed on the agency's website.
